#### SIGNIFICANCE OF THE MONTH

#### **NEW YEAR CELEBRATION**

New Year is the time or day at which a new calendar year begins and the calendar's year count increments by one.

Many cultures celebrate the event in some manner and the 1st day of January is often marked as a national holiday.

In the Gregorian calendar, the most widely used calendar system today, New Year occurs on January 1 (New Year's Day). This was also the first day of the year in the original Julian calendar and of the Roman calendar (after 153 BC).



#### **PONGAL CELEBRATION**

Pongal is a four-day-long harvest festival celebrated in Tamil Nadu, which falls in the month of Thai (that is, the January-February season) when crops like rice, sugarcane, turmeric etc. are harvested.

The term 'Pongal' in Tamil means "to boil", and this festival is celebrated as a thanksgiving ceremony for the year's harvest. Pongal, one of the important Hindu festivals, falls around the same time as Lohri every year, which is around mid-January.

Pongal also happens to be the name of a dish consumed during this festive time, which is sweetened rice boiled with lentils.

#### **REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION**


India gained its independence on 15 August 1947, after which the process of preparing a constitution was started. The Constitutionwas passed on 26 November 1949 in the Constituent Assembly. It was adopted on 26 January 1950 with a democratic government system. 26 January was selected, because it was this day in 1930 when the Declaration of Indian Independencewas passed. India achieved independence from British rule on 15 August 1947 following the Indian independence movement noted for largely peaceful nonviolent resistance and civil disobedience led by the Indian National Congress.






#### **EVENTS & CELEBRATIONS OF THE MONTH**

Students of grade 9 experimented the growth of the apical tissue by growing the onion roots. They observed what would be the result if the tips of the roots were cut.


#### **WONDERS OUT OF WASTE**
