May - 1 (International Labour Day or May Day)

The first day of the month is among the notable important days in May. This day is celebrated in India and throughout the world as Labour Day.



May - 8 (World Red Cross Day)

It is observed every year on 8 May. This day honours those millions of volunteers, staff, and members across the world who protect human life and health. It is celebrated to commemorate the birth anniversary of the founder of the Red Cross and International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) Henry Dunant.



May - 9 (Mother's Day)

Every year, Mother's Day is celebrated to appreciate mothers, who play an immensely important role in one's life. This special day is celebrated every year on the second Sunday of May.



May - 12 (International Nurses Day)

International Nurses Day is celebrated around the world on 12 May (the anniversary of Florence Nightingale's birth) of each year, to mark the contributions nurses make to society.



ORIGIN OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE

English is a West Germanic language that originated from Anglo-Frisian dialects brought to Britain in the mid 5th to 7th century AD by Anglo-Saxon migrants from what is now northwest Germany, southern Denmark and the Netherlands. The parent tongue, called Proto-Indo-European, was spoken about 5,000 years ago by nomads believed to have roamed the southeast European plains. Germanic, one of the language groups descended from this ancestral speech, is usually divided by scholars into three regional groups: East (Burgundian, Vandal, and Gothic, all extinct), North (Icelandic, Faroese, Norwegian, Swedishand Danish), and West (German, Dutch, Frisian, and English). English is related to most other languages spoken in Europe and western Asia from Iceland to India.

Modern English is <u>analytic</u> (i.e., relatively unchanged), whereas Proto-Indo-European, the ancestral tongue of most of the modern European languages (e.g., German, French, Russian, Greek), was <u>synthetic</u>, or inflected. During the course of thousands of years, English words have been slowly simplified from the inflected variable forms found in <u>Sanskrit</u>, <u>Greek</u>, <u>Latin</u>, <u>Russian</u>, and German, toward invariable forms, as in <u>Chinese</u> and <u>Vietnamese</u>., if the Modern English word ride is compared with the corresponding words in Old English and Modern German, it will be found that English now has only 5 forms (ride, rides, rode, riding, ridden), whereas Old English ridan had 13, and Modern German reiten has 16.

HOW TO MAKE ENGLISH AN INTERESTING SUBJECT:

10 INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE






