The year 1972 marked a turning point in the development of international environmental politics, with the first major conference on environmental issues, known as the Conference of the Human Environment, or the Stockholm



Conference. Later that year, on 15 December, the General Assembly adopted a resolution designating June 5 as World Environment Day and urging "Governments and the organizations in the United Nations system to undertake on that day every year world-wide activities reaffirming their concern for the preservation and enhancement of the environment, with a view to deepening environmental awareness."

UNESCO has an important track record in advancing ecological sciences through pioneering work on ecosystems, biosphere reserves, capacity building, scientific

assessments and policy briefs to assist decision-makers in managing natural resources sustainably.


WORLD OCEAN DAY

BRIDGE COURSE AND MANDATORY ACADEMIC STRENGTHENING SESSION










SOCIAL

EARTH IS LIKE A TERRARIUM



On account of World Earth Day, the children were asked to present posters on the ways to preserve earth and it's resources, pertaining to the Topic-"Restore our Earth".















1. Count the number if triangles inside the quadrilaterals



2. Count the triangle - Triangle having number of bisects from the vertex




3. Count the triangle - Triangle having number of bisects with vertex and horizontal line.



4. Count the triangle – With in embedded triangle







