








# Experimental Analysis – 9<sup>th</sup> Jan 2020


MYP2 students performing an experiment with prism to learn about electromagnetic radiation and its effects of causing different colours of light from a single white light


- They secured 5<sup>th</sup> place from a total of 24 teams participated in the Basketball Under 18 competition.

opportunity to solve a scenario by visiting our school accountant (pretended as a bank accountant) requesting for money. They gained details from the accountant about the money available in the bank and the information about the accounts in the bank which enhanced their thinking skills and analytical skills. The students related to their previous experience of visiting the bank with their parents and them getting cash from the bank. Through this role-play, they identified the real fact about the money available in the bank.



## Exploring Nature – 28th Jan 2020

Our junior school learners from PYP 1 decided to go for a campus walk this week, exploring their vicinity and observing the trees present around. They listed the different parts of plants/trees and brainstormed to have a clear understanding of the role of each part of plant/tree in its growth process. Students collected materials such as leaf, stone, paper, stick from the school campus and sorted them into finite and infinite resources.

The PYP 2 learners decided to learn about themselves and their peers . They had fun making posters of their physical and personality traits. They also drew and wrote about their peers physical traits such as she is tall/short, she has brown/black hair etc.,

This session enhanced their conceptual understanding, that, physical appearance is what we see and personality traits are what we feel.

The students exhibited a great deal of open – mindedness and appreciation they had learned at Gateway, the previous years. Each child appreciated the presented poem and provided constructive feedback in a very professional manner. This is a great example of where IB children displayed exemplary professional qualities.





### Sharing the Planet - 30th Jan 2020

Mr. Naresh Kumar, a General Manager from Amphenol Industries, as a guest speaker addressed the PYP 4 and 5 learners on technology and it's environmental impacts. Technology has affected almost all walks of human life, from education to social life. It has drastically changed the cultural norms and human behavior.

He spoke about the nature of technologies and its advancement explaining the two dimensions of technology i.e. physical devices and the technical skills employed to create these devices. He gave insight on the positive and negative impacts of technology highlighting the facts on global inequality and impact on the natural environment leading to environmental stress in the form of air/water pollution and solid waste disposal which are directly or indirectly harming the environment in the long run.

He gave a deep insight into the Tesla cars and the benefits of using them and also mentioned that they are the pioneers in manufacturing them.

The students found the lecture highly informative and riveting since he backed up the theories with incidents and stories from across the globe. On the whole, the session was an excellent source of value-added information for our learners.



Today's Guest lecture helped the energetic students to gain more points on the inquiry into the theme,' Sharing the Planet, 'was done by Ms. Archana a parent of Archit who contributed to extending valuable information to the students of PYP 5 to assist them on the journey to the Exhibition. The students of PYP 4 and 5 received an excellent opportunity to be addressed by Ms. Archana, a senior official with the government of India's **FCI** Department (**Food Corporation of India**).

The students received insightful information on the role of the government in the systemic distribution of food (Rice, Wheat, etc.) across India also known as **PDS** (**Public Distribution System**) for the common man or the underprivileged group of people of our country. They were introduced to the concept of subsidy along with the supply management system of FCI. She drew special attention to the regulation of the market price of the food grain and operation system i.e., the Procurement, Storage, and Movement of the food grains across country. The students were highly curious about the manual laborer and the benefits provided to these laborers working for FCI.

This session was highly informative and helped students understand the background work and effort that goes into the distribution of food grains from the farmer to the common man in our country.



#### <u>Human Actions and its Impact on our Planet – 31st Jan 2020</u>

The guest lecture which happened for the PYP 5 students on 29.01.2020 by the MYP chemistry teacher Ms.Nishanthini, gave a deep insight into the inquiry on the theme 'How the world works,' and the central idea on 'Human actions and its impact on our planet.'

The lecture dealt with the topics, 'Interdependence, Sustainability, and Technology, the students brainstormed on the various aspects, sources of energy, Finite&Infinite; renewable and non-renewable resources, Interdependence, overpopulation, deforestation, Global warming, carbon footprint, and humans' impact on the environment.

The students interacted well and the lecture was very informative as the students jotted down the important points and had a clear overview of the theme for the exhibition.



#### Creative Writing – 30<sup>th</sup> Jan 2020


