

The committee in charge was asked to develop the policy by consulting the team members and planning the activities to be taken in the school. The Head of school gave some insights that need to be addressed in the policy.






PYP Unit 2 -Effervescence Event- 9th November 2022




<u>PYP 1-5 Unit 3 Introduction Session – 11th November 2022</u>

Thus, it was a very interactive session as they understood the trans-disciplinary theme, its descriptors, the central idea, lines of inquiry, key & related concepts, the ATL skills, and the action-personal or service-oriented actions that the students can take.

The parents were glad and appreciated the efforts that were extended towards the developmental growth in the student's academics, and they were also informed on how effective Managebac was utilized, as they could view the process of learning engagements and the goals that were set for reaching the next level. They were explained about the formative and summative assessments, which are an ongoing process and are recorded in the student's academic records. Guest Lecturer for PYP 2-5 – 15th November 2022: Date: 15.11.2022

Mr. Anand Uthirapathy, a parent who volunteered to accept our invitation for a guest lecture and he would love to share his experiences with an age-appropriate audience (a group of students) on the different cultural identities and the importance of the places he had visited around the world, as well as Indian culture and beliefs.

The guest lecturer has 20 years of experience in the IT industry, is working as an associate Vice President at Standard Chartered Bank, holds a Master of Science degree from Bits Pilani, has travelled to five different continents and 25 countries and loves to read books in English and Tamil.

He gave a guest lecture on the human society and lifestyle of people all around the world. He helped us support the students and enhance their in-depth understanding of the concepts through a PowerPoint presentation. He narrated about three countries, such as Norway, Japan, and India, in terms of adaptation, migration, and settlement, and also made the students understand the different types of flags and their colors.

He explained the pros and cons of the lifestyle, types of houses, climate, language, food, and traditional dresses of the countries.

The lecturer's patience knew no bounds as he interacted with the curious little children on all that they inquired about. The students understood and were open-minded about accepting and respecting other people's perspectives as a result of this guest lecture.

Overall, it was an informative guest lecture as the students were given some handouts as part of their reflection to enhance their thinking skills.



Evaluation Visit – 16th to 18th November 2022

An evaluation visit is a process of formal reflection involving all stakeholders within the school community. The IB self-study is a stringent process that schools engage in to assess their own implementation of the Programme.

As we had completed five years of authorization, we underwent a 3-day continuum (PYP, MYP, and DP) evaluation visit from November 16–18, 2022.

The evaluation team members were very satisfied to witness the classes that were scheduled during the evaluation visit. During the class visit, they interacted with the enthusiastic students and asked a lot of provocative questions about the learning and the process of their understanding of the concepts, as well as about their progress in reflecting on the unit.

The EL and PL met the parents of our students as a part of our school community meeting to understand the proceedings of the learners and how the school supported them in their endeavors. They were also asked about the learning and how their wards reflected on the learning at home. Further, they inquired about the IB PYP elements to understand if the IB learner profile and ATL skills were evident in their ward's learning and how the students perceived the rudiments.


This visit played a crucial role in making the entire team aware of their strengths and identifying areas for growth. The evaluation team observed the following strengths of the school community:

MYP 3 students presented their learning because they had to raise awareness for their service as an action activity, so their target audience was the PYP children as they shared their knowledge of what they had learned. They explained about endangered animals like Asiatic lions, Indian rhinos, Nilgiri tahr, and red pandas. They also explained the external features and appearances of animals and made the younger minds reflect as they posed questions as to why these animals are endangered, what will happen if they go extinct, and how they can help to save these endangered animals.

They mentioned the habitats and threats of these animals. The number of animals remaining all over the world is indicative of the status of these animals, as they play an important role in the forest ecosystem. Students took part in brainstorming sessions, inquiring about the reasons for it and the steps being taken to keep the animals safe.

The PYP students actively participated as they interacted and asked their peers more intricate questions, which made the MYP 3 students, also reflect on and respond to their queries. It was indeed an exchange of learning through their peers and was very informative and constructive as they made connections with the present unit.




Whole School Collaboration Meeting – 28th November 2022


Parent-Teacher Meeting – 3rd December 2022


